

## A+ for Energy Frequently Asked Questions

### 1. What is BP?

### 2. Why is BP offering a grant program to teachers in my area?

### 3. Who can apply for an A+ for Energy grant?

Any public, separate, private/independent K-12 teacher currently teaching in an accredited or licensed school in Alberta is encouraged to apply.

### 4. How many proposals can be submitted from a school?

There is no limit to the number of applications a school can submit; however, each proposal must be a unique project idea.

### 5. If a team of teachers applies for an A+ for Energy grant, do they all have to be from the same school?

Teaching teams can be from the same school, across schools or across districts. However, any partnerships between classrooms and/or between schools should benefit everyone involved.

### 6. Is the A+ for Energy program only for science teachers?

No. The A+ for Energy grants are for all teachers, regardless of what they teach. Winners have included teachers of mathematics, english/language arts, history, social science, music, dance, technical arts and science.
